5th Grade: This week we will continue to work with the wonderful world of fractions and understand how equivalent fractions relate to the ability to add/subtract fractions with unlike denominators.


5th Grade Honors: This we will continue to work through the wonderful world of fractions with an emphasis on dividing fractions.
