

It's an exciting and unbelievable time; how can 8th grade students be so close to leaving us at Trinity!?? 7th Gr Honor Students are also writing a Current Events Essay concurrent with the 8th Grade class.

The 7th Gr Honor Students are writing a Current Events Essay that requires research, outlining, paragraphing, and final drafting. This is a great writing assignment, one where they had a choice of topics and where we did not repeat any of those topics.
