5-6 Science: We took our Classification test on Friday and that will give us time to complete one more unit on Symbiosis. There is a lot of review in this unit and it is one I think the students will do well on to end the year.

7-8 Science: We will continue our unit on the Nitrogen Cycle through next week and it will be our last unit of study. There are some new concepts and ideas in this unit and we will review to make sure students understand as we go along. The test will be on Friday next week.

5th U.S. History: We are well into the Civil War and are working towards wrapping up our year in US History. The students have improved so much in taking notes, asking good questions and participating. Our final test will be on Chapter 9 on Thursday, May 18th.

H.S. Geography: The class just started our last chapter of the year on Australia and New Zealand. We will finish up this chapter this next week and then begin preparing for the Final Exam. 5th Grade: Greetings to all! Our 5th Grade Class has begun our Poetry Unit. We have written an "I AM" poem and some students have read their samples orally. The next genre will be exploring how Haiku is written!

6th Grade: Our 6th Grade/5th Gr H. class have received their Poetry Packets. The students will be challenged to find samples of the various genres and will model their own poetry!

7th Grade & 6th Gr Honor Students: The 7th Grade & 6th Gr Honor students have begun to work on their poetry unit. We have begun writing the famous "I AM" poem genre. We've discussed how great it was that we've had our Grammar practice units prior to beginning to write this poem. We'll be practicing this poetry, we'll read some samples from students who volunteer to read their poetry, and we'll then transition to exploring the Haiku genre. I'm excited to see how many unique forms of poetry are created in our class!

8th Grade + 7th Gr Honor Students: We have begun reading "Book II: Between" of *Son*. We'll be finishing the middle portion of the book, and we'll read the final portion "Beyond" where we put together the pieces and our main character and we see how persistence, and even God's hand guides her to find the most important person in her life.

7th Gr Ancient History (7th): Greetings to all! We have begun the final chapter that we'll study this school year! We're studying the Ancient Roman Civilization! We'll read about the great orator Cicero, we'll learn about the Roman Forum, and we'll see where the word "Republic" originated and how it plays a part in our governmental structure today!
